The City Council of the City of Fort Morgan, Colorado, met this day in the Council Chambers of City Hall. The Honorable Mayor Jack L. Darnell called the regular meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

The meeting was also attended by City Manager Pat Merrill, City Attorney Jeffrey Wells, Police Chief Keith Kuretich, Director of Water Resources/Wastewater Treatment Gary Dreessen, Municipal Engineer Brad Curtis, Director of Human Resources & Risk Management Jody Prentice, Community Services Director Don Shedd, Community Development Director David Callahan, Treasurer Terri Schafer and City Clerk Andrea Strand.

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**PRESENTATION BY PRISCILLA MCCOY (ARTHUR J. GALLAGHER) PROVIDING AN OVERVIEW OF EQUIPMENT BREAKDOWN INSURANCE COVERAGE THROUGH TRAVELERS CASUALTY INSURANCE**

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Director Prentice introduced Priscilla McCoy, from Arthur J. Gallagher Risk Management Services, who presented an overview of the City's Equipment Breakdown Insurance Coverage.

She explained the types of equipment covered which included electrical, mechanical, air conditioning, refrigeration, communication systems, boiler and pressure vessels. Examples of equipment that might be damaged in a covered loss included emergency generators, fire detection systems and security systems, power transformers, electrical distribution systems, air conditioning systems and cooling towers, and many more.

Councilmembers Powers asked if equipment failure were to cause an explosion and damage the property of others, would the City be covered. She stated that the City had a \$1,000 deductible on all claims except transformers, which carried a \$5,000 deductible. She recommended that any damage be reported to the City's Risk Management Director who will refer the claim to the insurance carriers, and they will investigate the cause of damage.

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**COUNCIL ACTING AS THE LOCAL LIQUOR LICENSING AUTHORITY  
PUBLIC HEARING ON THE APPLICATION FROM EL JACAL CORP., DBA EL JACAL MEXICAN GRILL, FOR HOTEL AND RESTAURANT LIQUOR LICENSE, LOCATED AT 105 WEST EIGHTH AVENUE**

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**Public Hearing**

Mayor Darnell made opening comments and read into the record:

This is a public hearing before the City Council of the City of Fort Morgan acting as the Local Liquor Licensing Authority for the City, to determine whether the application for a Hotel and Restaurant liquor license by El Jacal Corporation, d/b/a El Jacal Mexican Grill (Applicant), should be granted or denied. This hearing will be conducted pursuant to the laws of the State of Colorado and the Ordinances and procedures of the City of Fort Morgan.

The purpose of this hearing is to receive information, data and testimony by any interested parties in order to enable the City to make findings and reach conclusions required to be made by state law as to whether or not the application should be approved or denied. One of the principal questions the Council will be concerned with throughout this hearing relates to the reasonable requirements of the neighborhood for the outlets applied for and the desires of the inhabitants of that neighborhood with respect to the outlet. Those persons who will be heard during this hearing are "parties of interest," who are defined by state law as being the applicant, residents of the neighborhood and owners or managers of businesses located in the neighborhood.

The order of this hearing will be as follows. At the conclusion of my opening comments, Staff will report on the public notice of the hearing, posting of the property, status of fingerprint reports, presentation of the application, and review of the petition. The Applicant will present their case, meaning they will present testimony, exhibits, petitions, or other materials relevant to the application. Interested parties may then testify for or against the proposed application, after which the Applicant will have the opportunity for rebuttal. At the conclusion of all testimony, the Council will make its decision to approve or deny the application.

All testimony will be given under oath given by the Mayor. Any exhibits presented during the hearing will be submitted to the City Clerk to become part of the record. The Clerk's official files are hereby admitted into the record of this hearing.

The Council previously set the boundaries of the neighborhood for the license as the City Limits of Fort Morgan. Does anyone present object to the boundaries of the neighborhood?

If not, we will proceed with the public hearing.

Clerk Strand stated that the application for a hotel and restaurant license had been accepted on July 7, 2009, and the public hearing was scheduled for August 18, 2009. The Affidavit of Publication for the Notice of Hearing had been published in *The Fort Morgan Times* on July 28, 2009. This meets the statutory notice requirements.

Chief Kuretich provided the Affidavit of Posting of the property at 105 West Eighth Avenue, Fort Morgan. The notice was posted on the property from August 4, 2009, to August 17, 2009.

Mayor Darnell asked for the introduction of the Applicant. Juan Martinez introduced himself.

Mayor Darnell administered the Oath to the Applicant, Juan Martinez.

Clerk Strand presented the application as complete with the appropriate fees being submitted.

Chief Kuretich had provided the background investigation report to the Local Licensing Authority and to the Applicant.

Clerk Strand presented the summary of the petition showing the needs of the neighborhood. She reported that sixty-three (63) individuals had signed the petition in favor of the retail liquor store located at 105 West Eighth Avenue in Fort Morgan, Colorado. Eleven (11) names were not qualified to sign, leaving fifty-two (52) signatures in favor.

Attorney Wells asked for the record if the applicant had any other exhibits or testimony to provide to the Authority; he had none.

Councilmember Powers stressed to the Applicant the importance of training to avoid selling alcohol to under-aged citizens.

Clerk Strand stated that no one from the public had provided written comments to her office.

No one from the public was present to provide comments.

Councilmember McAlister offered a motion to close the public hearing. His motion was seconded by Councilmember Shaver and carried unanimously.

### **Action on the Application**

Attorney Wells provided options to the Liquor Licensing Authority to approve, continue or disapprove of the application that was submitted for a Hotel and Restaurant liquor license by El Jacal Corp., dba El Jacal Mexican Grill, located at 105 West Eighth Avenue, in Fort Morgan. He presented Findings of Fact that a complete application was submitted and the requirements of the neighborhood, the wants and needs of the adult population of the City of Fort Morgan and that good morale character of the applicants had been met.

**Councilmember Powers offered a motion to approve the application for a Hotel and Restaurant liquor license by El Jacal Corp., dba El Jacal Mexican Grill, located at 105 West Eighth Avenue in Fort Morgan. His motion was seconded by Councilmember Shaver and carried unanimously.**

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### **COUNCIL ACTING AS THE LOCAL LIQUOR LICENSING AUTHORITY PRESENTATION OF AN APPLICATION FOR A NEW 3.2% BEER LIQUOR LICENSE FOR NPC INTERNATIONAL, INC., DBA PIZZA HUT #4850, LOCATED AT 1200 W. PLATTE AVENUE**

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Clerk Strand reviewed the application received by NPC International, Inc., dba Pizza Hut #4850, located at 1200 W. Platte Avenue. The applicant submitted a complete application for a new license and submitted the appropriate fees. She stated that once a public hearing is scheduled, the applicant will circulate their petition, the City Clerk's Office will publish the Notice of Public Hearing and the Police Department will post the property. Staff is requesting a motion to accept the application, request that the neighborhood be defined as in the City limits of Fort Morgan and schedule a public hearing for October 6, 2009. The Applicant's manager was present for questions.

**Councilmember Powers moved to accept the application for a 3.2% Beer liquor license for NPC International Inc., dba Pizza Hut #4850, to define the neighborhood and to hold a public hearing on October 6, 2009. His motion was seconded by Councilmember Simmons and duly carried.**

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**COUNCIL ACTING AS THE LOCAL LIQUOR LICENSING AUTHORITY  
APPROVE THE POSTING OF THE PROPERTY FOR A SPECIAL EVENT LIQUOR LICENSE  
APPLICATION SUBMITTED BY THE BENEVOLENT PROTECTIVE ORDER OF ELKS,  
LODGE #1143, LOCATED AT 430 STATE STREET, FOR AN EVENT SCHEDULED ON  
SEPTEMBER 18 AND 19**

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City Clerk Andrea Strand presented an application for a Special Events Permit requested by Fort Morgan Elks located at 430 State Street to sell Malt, Vinous and Spirituous Liquor at an event on September 18 and 19. She explained a requirement of the permit is to post the event to provide the public an opportunity to object. She also requested it be placed on the September 1, 2009, agenda to hear any objections from the public and to issue the permit. The appropriate fees had been paid for the permit.

**Councilmember Shaver offered a motion to approve the posting of the property at 430 State Street concerning the application by Fort Morgan Elks for a Special Events Permit to sell Malt, Vinous and Spirituous Liquor on September 18 and 19, and to schedule to approve the issuance of the Special Events Permit at the next Regular Council Meeting on September 1. His motion was seconded by Councilmember Forstedt and duly carried.**

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**PETITION FOR ANNEXATION BY SALUD FAMILY HEALTH CENTERS, LLC, AND THE  
CITY OF FORT MORGAN, COLORADO**

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**Public Hearing**

Mayor Darnell stated, "Let the record show that on July 7, 2009, the City Council of the City of Fort Morgan adopted a Resolution finding the Salud Family Health Centers, LLC, Petition for Annexation was in substantial compliance with C.R.S. §31-12-107. Thereafter, a Hearing was set for tonight August 18, 2009, for the Council of the City of Fort Morgan to consider the annexation of the area set forth in the Annexation Plat submitted with the Petition. The public hearing will be opened to receive evidence concerning the requirements established under C.R.S. §31-12-104 and C.R.S. §31-12-105 and other pertinent evidence required under the Annexation Act of 1965 as amended."

Clerk Strand reported an Affidavit of Publication for the Notice of Petition for Annexation was published in *The Fort Morgan Times* for four insertions with the first publication on July 17, 2009, and the last publication on August 7, 2009. She also presented a Certified Mailing to the Board of County Commissioners, and special districts or school districts having territory within the area to be annexed and verified the mailing as July 22, 2009.

Director Callahan presented the Petition and Evidence and stated that the petition meets the state statues and is in compliance. He provided an Annexation Impact Report and stated that there were no financial concerns to the City.

The applicants, Thomas Beck and Jeff Greenlee, were present to answer questions from Council. They stated they had outgrown their current facility and will build a new medical and dental clinic.

There were no written or oral comments from the public.

Comments by City Council. Councilmember Powers asked if the water rights had been considered in this transaction. The applicant and staff stated they would review this for the final hearing.

Councilmember Powers offered a motion to close the public hearing. His motion was seconded by Councilmember Shaver and duly carried.

### **Action on the Petition for Annexation**

Attorney Wells stated that a two-part action was needed. He presented a resolution for their adoption that set forward the facts in the documentation presented, impact statement and various other facts associated. Statutory requirements must be met before the property is eligible for annexation.

Councilmember Powers offered the following Resolution and moved for its adoption. His motion was seconded by Councilmember Simmons; said Resolution being in words, letters and figures as follows, to-wit:

### **RESOLUTION NO. 09 08 06**

#### **A RESOLUTION SETTING FORTH FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW BASED THEREON AND DETERMINING THE STATUS OF THE TERRITORY SOMETIMES KNOWN AS THE SALUD PROPERTY HEREINAFTER MORE SPECIFICALLY DESCRIBED BELOW**

#### **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT MORGAN:**

This matter comes on for hearing before the City Council of the City of Fort Morgan on August 18, 2009, pursuant to Sections 31-12-108 and 31-12-109, C.R.S., known as the Municipal Annexation Act of 1965 as amended, to consider the annexation of that certain territory sometimes known as the Salud Annexation, more specifically described in Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

Whereas, the Council having examined all of the evidence presented at said hearing and being fully advised of the premises, now sets forth findings of fact and conclusions of law based thereon as provided for in Section 31-12-110 of the Annexation Act, other findings of fact and conclusions as are appropriate, and makes determinations as follows:

1. The City Clerk of the City of Fort Morgan has received a petition for annexation of the area described in herein entitled "Petition for Annexation," signed by persons owning more than fifty percent (50%) of the territory included in the area proposed to be annexed and comprise more than fifty percent (50%) of the area, excluding public streets and alleys, in compliance with the provisions of Article II, Section 30 of the Colorado Constitution, and Section 31-12-107(1) of the Annexation Act.

2. On July 7, 2009, the City Council approved Resolution No. 09 07 02 finding that the Petition for Annexation of the area described herein to be in substantial compliance with Section 31-12-107(1) C.R.S. and setting a Hearing Date for the Fort Morgan City Council to consider the annexation of the area. This resolution set a hearing to consider the annexation of this area to the City of Fort Morgan on August 18, 2009, at Council Chambers, City Hall, 100 Main Street, Fort Morgan, Colorado, and directed the City Clerk to give notice of said hearing in the manner

prescribed in Section 31-12-108, C.R.S. of the Annexation Act. In addition, said resolution found that the Petition for Annexation is in substantial compliance with Section 31-12-107(1), C.R.S. of the Annexation Act, and further determined that said petition is in substantial compliance with Section 30 of Article II of the Colorado Constitution, which findings are adopted herein.

3. The City Clerk, pursuant to said resolution, has caused to have published in the Fort Morgan Times a Public Notice of Public Hearing of an Annexation Petition of area herein described, along with a copy of said resolution and petition with an attached legal description of the area to be annexed, with four (4) publications as follows: July 17, 2009; July 24, 2009; July 31, 2009; and August 7, 2009. The Fort Morgan Times is a daily newspaper in general circulation throughout the City of Fort Morgan, throughout the area to be annexed, and throughout Morgan County, Colorado.

4. Said resolution and notice pertaining thereto as set forth in Paragraph 3 of this resolution comply with the requirements of §31-12-107(1)(g) and §31-12-108, C.R.S. of the Annexation Act.

5. Copies of the published notice and resolution have been mailed to the Board of County Commissioners Morgan County, to the Morgan County Attorney and to the School District located within the territory described herein as required by § 31-12-108, C.R.S. of the Annexation Act.

6. The annexation impact report is required as the property to be annexed is comprised of more than 10 acres.

7. The area described herein is unincorporated.

8. The area described herein is the same as the area described in the annexation plat.

9. No annexation of all or any part of said area has been commenced by any other municipality.

10. This annexation will not result in the detachment of an area from any school district and attachment of the same area to another school district.

11. This annexation will not result in the change of any county boundaries.

12. At least one-sixth (1/6th) of the boundary of the perimeter of the area proposed to be annexed is contiguous with the boundary of the City of Fort Morgan.

13. No land held in identical ownership within the area proposed to be annexed, whether consisting of one tract or parcel of real estate or two or more contiguous tracts or parcels of real estate, has been divided into separate parts or parcels by the boundaries of such annexation without the written consent of the landowner except as such tracts or parcels are separated by a dedicated street, road or other public way.

14. No land held in identical ownership within the area proposed to be annexed, whether consisting of one tract or parcel of real estate or two or more contiguous tracts or parcels of real estate, comprising twenty (20) acres or more (which, together with the buildings and improvements situated thereon, has a valuation for assessment in excess of \$200,000 for ad

valorem tax purposes for the next year preceding the annexation), has been included within the boundary of the area proposed to be annexed without the written consent of the landowners.

15. This annexation will not extend boundaries of the city limits of the City of Fort Morgan more than three miles in any direction from the municipal boundary.

16. In establishing the boundaries of the area proposed to be annexed, if a portion of a platted street or alley is annexed, the entire width of said street or alley is included within the area proposed to be annexed.

17. The applicable parts of Section 31-12-105 of the Annexation Act have been met.

20. The provisions of Section 31-12-104(b) requiring a finding that "[t]hat a community of interest exists between the area proposed to be annexed and the annexing municipality; that said area is urban or will be urbanized in the near future; and that said area is integrated with or is capable of being integrated with the annexing municipality..." are met by virtue of a finding of at least one-sixth (1/6th) boundary contiguity with the City of Fort Morgan as provided for in said section.

21. No petition for election has been received nor is an election otherwise required under the provisions of Section 31-12-107(2) of the Annexation Act.

22. The annexation of the Salud Property as legally described in the annexation map meet the requirements of and fully complies with Part 1 of Article 12 of Title 31 C.R.S., the Municipal Annexation Act of 1965 as amended, and Section 30 of Article II of the Colorado Constitution.

23. The City Council finds and concludes that said territory is eligible for annexation to the City of Fort Morgan.

**AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE THE GRANT APPLICATION AGREEMENT BY  
AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF FORT MORGAN AND NE COLORADO CELLULAR, INC.,  
D/B/A VIAERO WIRELESS**

WHEREAS, President Obama signed the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, Pub L. 111-5, 123 Stat. 115 (2009) ("ARRA" or "Recovery Act"); and,

WHEREAS, the Rural Utilities Service ("RUS") will award loans, loan guarantees, and competitive grants through the Broadband Initiatives Program ("BIP") funded by the ARRA; and,

WHEREAS, the National Telecommunications and Information Administration ("NTIA") will award competitive grants under the Broadband Technology Opportunities Program ("BTOP") funded by the ARRA; and,

WHEREAS, the NTIA and the RUS published the "Notice of Funds Availability (NOFA) and solicitation of applications" ("NoFA") on July 9, 2009, in the Federal Register; and,

WHEREAS, NE COLORADO CELLULAR, INC., d/b/a Viaero Wireless, a Colorado corporation wishes to obtain grants or loans under the NoFA and will submit one or more grant applications to the NTIA and to the RUS using an application substantially in the form of the document entitled "Broadband Infrastructure Application Submission to RUS (BIP) and NTIA (BTOP)" and available at [www.broadbandusa.gov](http://www.broadbandusa.gov) as of the First Application Deadline defined herein ("Applications"); and each, an "Application"); and,

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Morgan wishes to secure broadband equipment and service for itself and its Constituents in order to more effectively accomplish its public objectives, and is eligible to apply for funds pursuant to the NoFA to accomplish these objectives; and,

WHEREAS, both entities have agreed to the terms and conditions as set forth in the Grant Application Agreement; and,

WHEREAS, in consideration of a cost discount on Service and for other consideration more particularly described in the Grant Application Agreement, the City wishes to request customer premises equipment, as that term is defined in section 3 of the Communications Act of 1934 ("CPE"), in cooperation with Viaero, through one or more Applications; and,

WHEREAS, City Staff has recommended the execution of the Grant Application Agreement, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT MORGAN, COLORADO:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the Grant Application Agreement.

### **ORDINANCE NO. 1086**

#### **AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE CHANGE OF NAME FOR THE PERMIT CONVEYED TO SOURCEGAS WATTENBERG LLC, AS GRANTED UNDER ORDINANCE 1060**

WHEREAS, on December 18, 2007, the Fort Morgan City Council passed Ordinance No. 1060, granting to SourceGas Wattenberg, LLC a permit authorizing and consenting to the construction, installation, operation and maintenance of a natural gas pipeline and related equipment and facilities within the City of Fort Morgan, pursuant to Sec. 22-B1 of the *Code of the City of Fort Morgan*; and,

WHEREAS, following a merger of all rights, privileges, powers, and obligations of both SourceGas Wattenberg and SourceGas Distribution LLC, SourceGas Distribution, LLC will hold the sole membership interest in both companies with SourceGas Distribution, LLC as the surviving entity; and,

WHEREAS, this merger does not contemplate a change in corporate control, management, or the operation of the pipeline; and,

WHEREAS, this name change will not affect any obligation to the City of Fort Morgan pursuant to Ordinance 1060.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT MORGAN, COLORADO, THAT:

Section 1. The City Council of the City of Fort Morgan hereby permits the name change resulting from the merger of SourceGas Wattenberg LLC and SourceGas Distribution LLC. Further, that such name change is hereby approved conditioned upon the written confirmation that all obligations and duties lawfully imposed on SourceGas Distribution LLC and more specifically SourceGas Wattenberg LLC, as permitted by Ordinance 1060 be satisfied.

Section 2. In addition to the previous requirements as provided under Ordinance 1060, SourceGas Distribution, LLC is required to notify the City of Fort Morgan in the event it undertakes any repairs or services within the City that may affect the function of the City's Gas Department.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage.
