February Events

“Makerspace Monthly” will be held on Tuesday, Feb. 7, at 5:30 p.m. Our February program will be “Crazy Creations” offered in the Makerspace Room.

“Storytime” is offered on Tuesday and Thursday mornings at 10:30 a.m. in the Children’s Library. A story and a craft are provided. Parents or guardians must accompany children. The program is free.

“Youth Winter Reading Program” runs from Jan. 30 to March 6. To enter, come to the library circulation desk and ask for a reading log. There are three categories in the program.

Elementary Readers: For every three hours you read, your name will be entered into a drawing for our “Little Literary Gift Basket.”

Middle School Readers: For every six hours of reading, your name will be entered into a drawing for our “Seekers of Wisdom Gift Basket.”

High School Readers: For every eight hours of reading, your name will be entered into a drawing for our “Champion of Words Gift Basket.”

All Readers: For each category, the participant who reads the most pages wins a \$50 gift card! Any reading for school or in school counts as well.

Winter Reading Program” runs from Jan. 30 to March 6. To join, ask for a reading log at the Circulation Desk. For every 500 pages read from any book, readers are entered into the prize drawing of their choice. There will be first- and second-place prize winners for “most pages read.” Prizes are: “Library Lovers Gift Bag,” “Romantic Readers Gift Bag” and a “Classic Fantastic Gift Bag.” There is also a \$75 first-place Visa gift card and a \$50 second-place Visa gift card for “most pages read.” Questions about either reading program will be answered by Sara at (970) 542-4014.


on the Trail,” with local artist Karol Mack. Karol’s program will feature artists that journeyed and recorded their experiences on the Oregon, California and Overland
