Fort Morgan Library held a Poet Laureate contest in April. The contest began on April 1. Poets age 18 and over entered a one-page typed poem. Poets granted permission for the public to read and vote on their poem.

The deadline for submission was April 15, at 5 p.m. From April 16 - April 30, the general public read and voted for their favorite poem. On May 1, the winning poem with the most votes will be announced.

The winning poet will be named Fort Morgan Public Library Poet Laureate of the Year. The winning poet will win a \$50 gift card.

As the press time of this newsletter is prior to May 1, the winning poet has not yet been determined.

Song Writing Workshop, June 1 / 1 - 3 p.m. Free Legal Clinic

Song writing is a craft. It is certainly as challenging as writing poetry.

Unlike conventional poetry, song lyrics usually rhyme. Songs also need to follow strict rules dealing with meter.

Then you have to deal with writing a melody! The melody should convey the mood of the lyric and offer contrast between sections. Song writing is no easy task. Need assistance? Help is on the way!

Nick Booker from "All Those That Wander" will be offering a free Song Writing Workshop on June 1, from 1 p.m. until 3 p.m. The workshop will be held in the Howard Rollin Memorial Community Room in the Library Museum building.
