## Thanksgiving forecast

Turkeys will thaw in the morning then warm in the oven to an afternoon high near 190 F. The kitchen will turn hot and humid, and if you bother the cook, be prepared for a severe squall. During the late afternoon and evening, a cold front will slice through the turkey like a knife, causing an accumulation of one to two inches on plates.

Mashed potatoes will drift across low lying areas, while cranberry sauce creates slippery spots on surfaces. Please use caution when passing.

A weight watch and indigestion warning have been issued for the entire area, with an increased high pressure system developing around the beltway. Periods of unsettled skirmishes could develop. During the evening, the turkey will diminish and taper off to leftovers, dropping to a low of 34 F in the refrigerator.

Looking ahead to Friday and Saturday, high pressure to eat sandwiches will develop. Flurries of leftovers can be expected both days, with a 50% chance of scattered soup late in the day.

By early next week, expect a warming trend as soup develops. Upper system pressure will lower as turkey flurries diminish.

## Colorado author series for November

Fort Morgan Museum Curator Brian Mack is the author of several books including "Morgan County," "One Room Schools of Morgan County," "Estes Park, Grand Lake and Rocky Mountain National Park" and

Brian has just released his 2019 book, "1773 Scotland: An Illustrated Account of Johnson & Boswell's Tour of Scotland." This book is the subject of this presentation.

This book contains excerpts from the original text of Boswell and Johnson's tour, and features historically re-created paintings of the locations

visited by the travelers. This work is a 20-year project which began in 1998.

What makes this publication so unique are the incredible oil paintings by artist Karol Mack that are included with each featured site. A few of Karol's paintings will be also displayed during the presentation. The program is free and the general public is invited.
